- \$100 2009-A FRN Solid 1s-LE 11111111 A. Tied for the finest known; this note is destined to be the pinnacle of an already impressive collection. PMG Superb Gem Unc 67EPQ \$8995
- \$50 2013 FRN Solid 1s-MF 11111111 B. Exceptional eye-appeal for this scarce denomination with solid ones. This note belongs in a 64 holder. PCGS-B Ch Unc 63 \$5995
- \$50 2013 FRN Solid 1s-MK 11111111 B. An equally-as-exciting, but considerably more affordable than the note above. Note presents as a very strong AU with only a whisper of a center bend during our inspection. Ch AU \$4250
- \$20 2013 FRN Solid 1s- MB 11111111 F. Superb Gem margins appear on this colorized twenty that presents quite well from both sides. PMG About Unc 53EPQ \$2995
- \$50 2013 FRN, Solid 2s-MJ22222222A. Attractive even margins on the colorized note with all 2s. Ch AU \$3995
- \$1 2006 FRN, Solid 4s-L44444444A. Gem margins with eight 4s that flood the SN. Great note; better price. PCGS-B Gem Unc 65PPQ \$1995



- \$1 1988-A FRN, Solid 8s-F88888888F. Always popular and rarely available. Scarce serial preserved in pristine condition. PMG Ch Unc 64EPQ \$6995
- \$1 2003-A FRN, Descending Ladder-F87654321H. A tough 8-1 down ladder with even boardwalk margins and incredible eye-appeal! PCGS-B Gem Unc 66PPQ \$2495
- \$1 1969 FRN, Ascending Ladder-C12345678A. A new purchase that barely arrived in time to be included! Ch CU \$2495

Mismatches from Mrs. Claus



- \$100 1929 Dayton, OH NBN, RARE Mismatch SN on \$100 National One of only two known, this \$100 small size national bank note has serial number 50 in the lower left and serial number 48 in the upper right. An absolutely unimaginable mistake that escaped on this brown seal hundred that's been maintained in an attractive collector grade. Good luck finding another. PCGS-B VF 25 \$17,950 or \$1495/month with a one year interest-free layaway
- \$1 1935-F SC, Mismatch \$1 Silver Cert STAR. Seventh digit mismatch as the lower left ends in -542 and the upper right ends in -532. Impressive on a blue seal, unthinkably cool on a blue seal star! PMG Ch Fine 15 \$1495
- \$1 1935-E SC, Mismatch \$1 Silver Cert-088/077. Two digit blue seal mismatch on the seventh and eighth digits. Lower left ends in 8 and upper right ends in 70. PMG Ch Unc 64EPQ \$1495
- \$1 1969-A FRN, Mismatch 42/ 32. A noticeable first digit mismatch that starts with 42 on the left and 32 on the right. PMG Ch Fine 15 \$495
- \$1 1977-A FRN, Mismatched Prefix-B/A. Note is from Boston and both prefixes should be an A, but the lower left SN starts with a B just a short distance from the black district seal which has an A! Incredibly cool and much tougher than a mismatched SN. PMG VF 25 \$995
- \$2 1976 FRN, Mismatched SN on Deuce. A sixth digit mismatch on this desirable deuce which causes the LL serial to end in -361 while the other ends in -461. PMG Gem Unc 66EPQ \$895
- \$10 1981 FRN, Mismatched Prefix on STAR-I/L-. Exceptional mismatched prefix on a star/ replacement note from Minneapolis. This note was created to be a replacement for a mistake, but somehow managed to escape with a mistake too! Ch AU \$2495
- \$100 1996 FRN, Mismatched SN on \$100. Big head hundred with a third digit mismatch. 152/ 156...Incredibly scarce denomination. PCGS VF 25 \$5995

- \$100 1891 TN, Fr.378, Rare Open Back \$100. Nearly 3 times scarcer than its iconic 1890 Watermelon predecessor. Only 13pcs known; 5 of which are locked in institutions. Professional restoration is confined to the margin and enhances the overall aesthetics of this rarity which is 1 of only 8 available to collectors. Open the Camera app on your smartphone to scan the QR code to see high-resolution images of both sides. PMG Fine 12 \$99,500. Interest-free terms available.
- \$20 1861, Fr. 11, Demand Note "PROOF" America's earliest Federal circulating paper money. Only 5 issued notes in public hands, with lowest grade bringing \$100k+. Unique as a proof. Serial number 00000, with expected punch hole cancellations. Dual sided and mounted on cardstock. PMG PROOF. Irreplaceable at any cost \$34,500

- \$10 1861 Demand Note, Fr.9, Key Demand Note. One of only 8 Cincinnati \$10s known—one of which is permanently impounded in the ANA museum. This is the lowest SN reported and has excellent color on both sides with essentially complete margins. Even with the minor issue of 'pinholes' this may be the finest-looking example. PMG VF 20 \$24,950
- \$2 Original Serial Number One-Lazy Deuce. FNB Kankakee, IL Ch. 1793. This is one of only about 3 dozen SN1 Lazy Deuces known from all banks in the country combined. PMG has given this rarity a 'net' due to some toning of the paper as well as some trivial edge damage that affects little, but on a National of this importance those imperfections are more than excusable. PMG VF 30, net \$24,500
- \$2 1976 FRN, Demand Double Print Deuce. Arguably the most dramatic US error ever produced. This sheet was fed through the overprint twice with 2 sets of different serial numbers, seals, and district numbers. Preserved in pristine condition. Certain to become the pinnacle of the collection it enters. PMG Gem Unc 65EPQ \$19,995
